UNION COUNTY 2020 GENERAL ELECTION PLAN

Early in-person voting will begin Tuesday, October 13th @ the Camp Breckinridge Museum from 8am-4pm. The address to the museum is: 1116 Village Square Rd, Morganfield, KY 42437

This facility has a big accommodating parking lot and a big spacious room to separate voters.

There will be 2 check-in tables, 4 voting stations (high-top tables), and two e-scan voting machines (one e-slate machine). **Total, we will need 5 people EACH DAY.** There will be 2 people at each table. One will be responsible for checking the voter in, the other will be responsible for giving the voter their ballot. The 5th person will wipe the machine after use, give the voter an "I voted" sticker and show the voter where to exit. **Early voting will have all 13 ballot faces, to accommodate any voter throughout the county.**

****Early voting will end on Monday, November 2nd. On the last day, I will add an e-scan machine, and have an additional table with another e-poll-book; planning to accommodate for a larger crowd. I will add 3 people to assist as well.**

Each person entering the Camp Breckinridge Museum for early in-person voting will be required to wear a mask and practice safe social distancing (poll workers included.) There will be plenty of hand sanitizer, gloves, wipes, paper towels, disinfectant spray and sneeze guards to protect poll workers and voters from each other. On each voting table, hand sanitizer will be available for voters to use.

Voters will be expected to enter through one door, and exit through another UNLESS, an individual has difficulty walking or is handicapped. For that individual, they will be permitted to exit through the front door, so they can access the ramp. (I met with EZ Access on 9/4, and they said that they will assist with an additional ramp.)

Beginning, Saturday October 17th and lasting through, Saturday October 31st from 8am-12pm; early voting will be offered to ALL voters at the Camp Breckinridge Museum (1116 Village Square Rd; Morganfield, KY 42437) on October 31st; a Waverly location (Waverly KC Hall; 114 N Maple St; Waverly, KY 42462) on October 24th and a Sturgis location (Sturgis Kiwanis Building; 715 N Monroe St; Sturgis, KY 42459) on October 17th. Any voter from within the county will be able to come and vote at ANY these Saturday voting centers. ALL 13 ballot faces will be available. **I am still working to determine where the Waverly and Sturgis locations will be.**

****The procedures and guidelines outlined above will be expected to be adhered to at the other early voting locations as well (Mask, safe social distancing, limited contact between voter and poll worker, etc.)**

For each early voting Saturday center, I will need 5 people. Like the museum, there will be two check-in tables and two e-scan machines (one e-slate machine).

On Election Day, regardless of where voters live geographically, **ALL** voters will be able to vote at one of these 3 voting centers: UC Museum (1116 Village Square Rd, Morganfield, KY 42437), Sturgis Elementary School (1101 N Grant St, Sturgis, KY 42459) or Uniontown Turner Building (Community Building; 532 2nd Street; Uniontown, KY 42461). ALL 13 ballot faces will be available at **EACH** location. At each facility (with the exception of Camp Breckinridge Museum), **12 poll workers will be needed.**

One poll worker will show voters where to park and which door to enter after parking at each facility, there will be **8** poll-workers manning four check-in tables (each table will have an e-poll book for checking in voters) one person at each table will check the voter in, while the other will give the voter their ballot). Lastly, there will be **2** people to wipe down each voting machine after use. I will have **one** additional person standing near the exit, that will give voters an “I voted” sticker as they exit the building. There will be four e-scan voting machines (one e-slate machine for handicap or visually impaired voters) and 8 voting station tables.

At the Camp Breckinridge Museum, since most registered voters live in the Morganfield area, there will be 5 check in tables (**10** people), 5 e-scan machines + one e-slate machine (**3** people; 2 to clean and one to stand near the exit and give voters their “I voted” sticker after voting), and 10 voting stations (tables). **Two** people will help direct people where to park and show them which way to go.

****Each voter as well as all poll workers will be required to practice safe social distancing and wear a mask. For poll workers, mask, gloves, hand sanitizer, wipes, paper towels and disinfectant spray will be provided. On each voting table, hand sanitizer will be available for voters to use.**

I plan to have 2 wheelchairs present at each in-person location on Election Day.

Also, GRITS will have 3 busses circulating in the Morganfield, Uniontown and Sturgis area on Election Day to pick up voters who need a ride to the polls. Voters will have to wear a mask, and **NO voter who has the coronavirus, or who is experiencing coronavirus-like symptoms will be permitted to ride.** The bus will pick the voter up, and also drop them back off at the same pick-up location. There will be no additional charge to the county for GRITS to provide rides for voters on Election Day. A phone number will be advertised (270-389-1334) to the public in advance, for them to call on Election Day who wish to receive a ride to the polls from GRITS.
