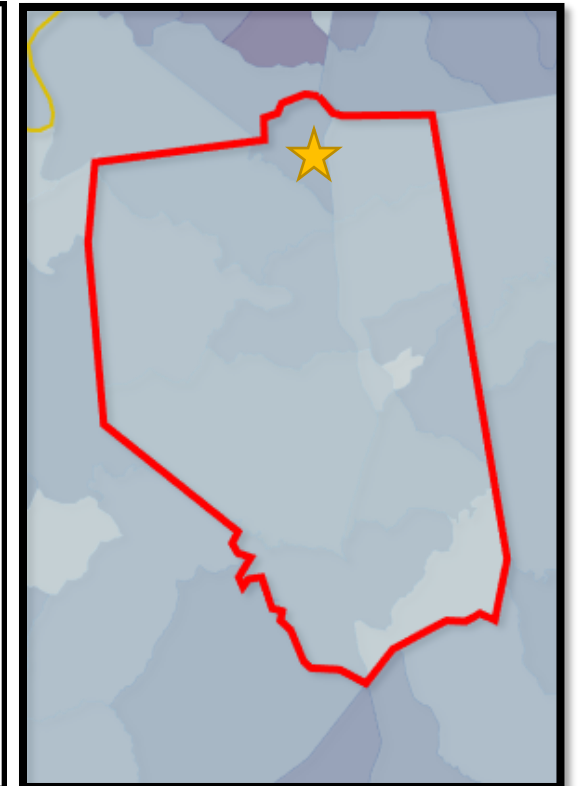

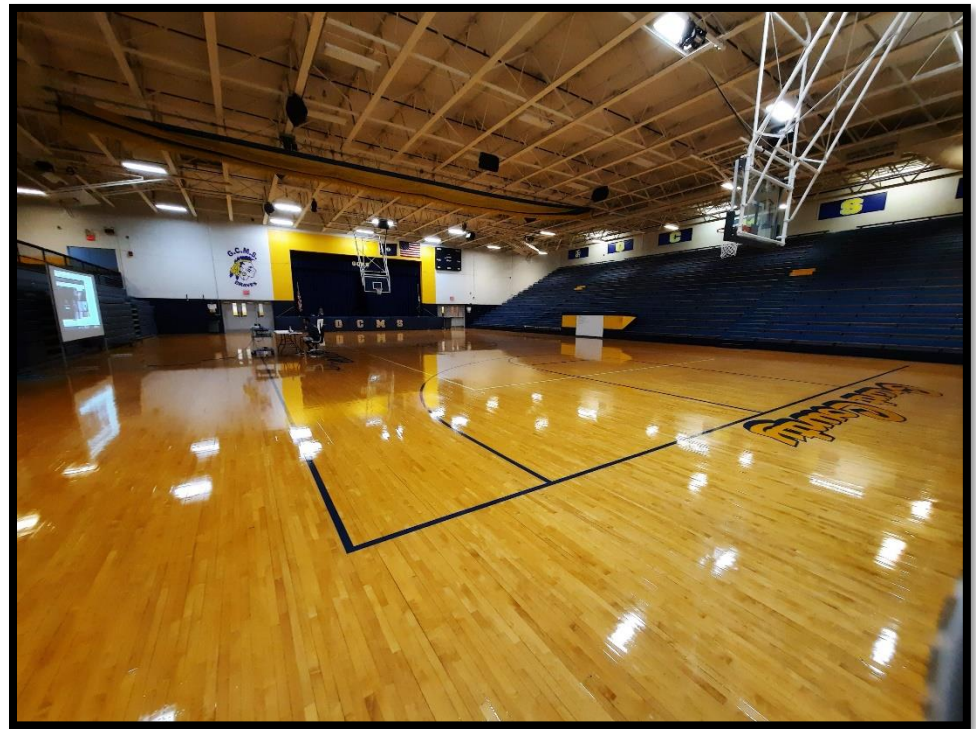
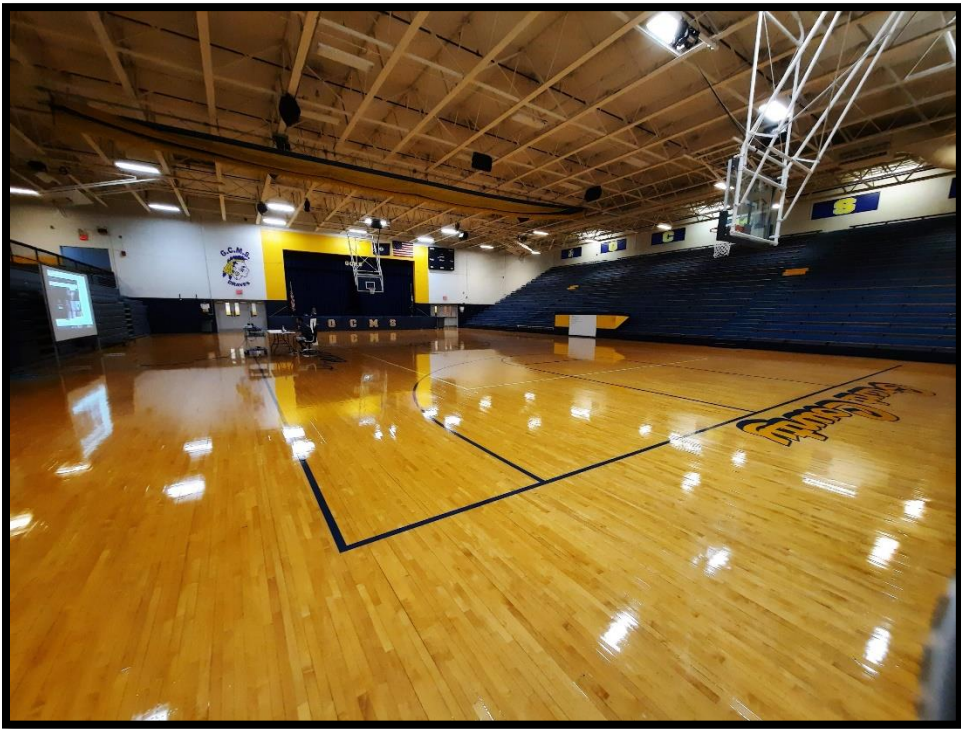


Crittenden Mt Zion Elementary

- Already a voting location
- Housed 5 precincts prior to 2020
- Ramp and cafeteria doors will be marked for entrance and exit sides
- Offers space conducive to serve as a vote center
- Serves voters in Crittenden, Mt Zion and Sherman communities

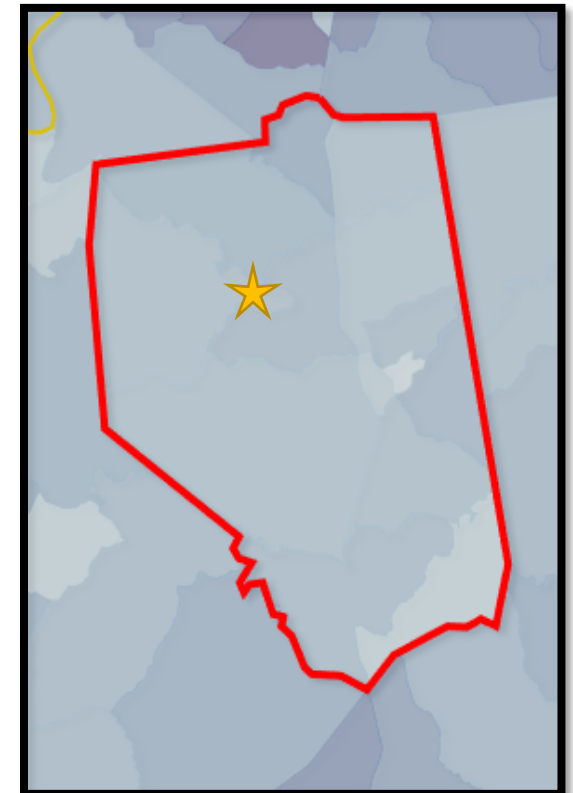


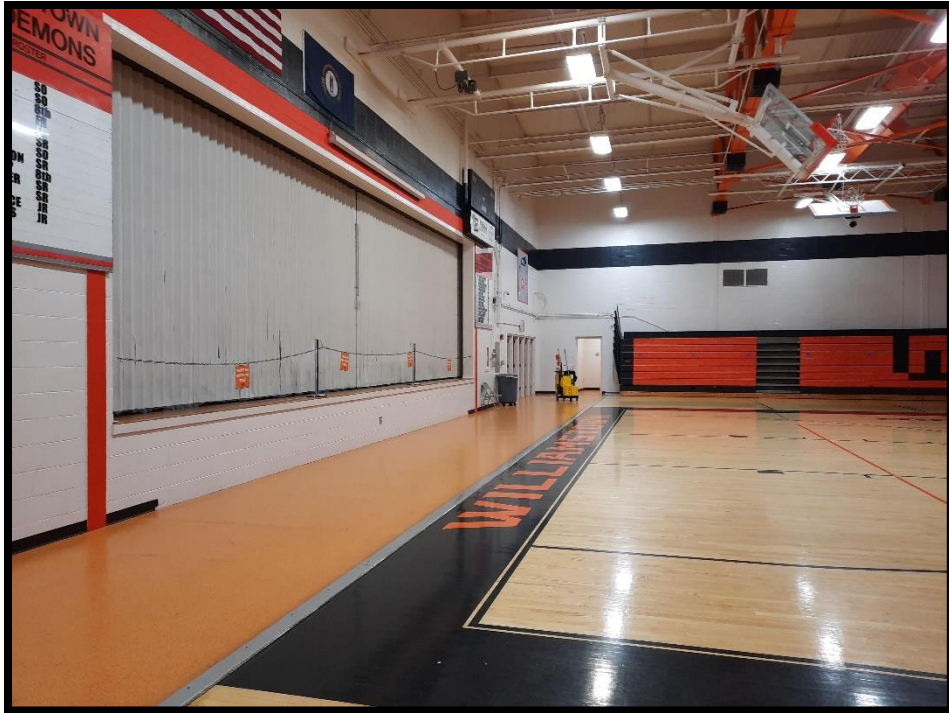


Grant County High School

Election Day County Wide Vote Center

- New Voting Location since 2022
- Replaces Grant County Middle School which housed eight (8) precincts prior to 2020 and addresses parking concerns
- Offers space conducive to serve as a vote center
- This will assist voters in Dry Ridge, Mt. Zion, and Sherman communities where we eliminated a precinct location due to connectivity issues

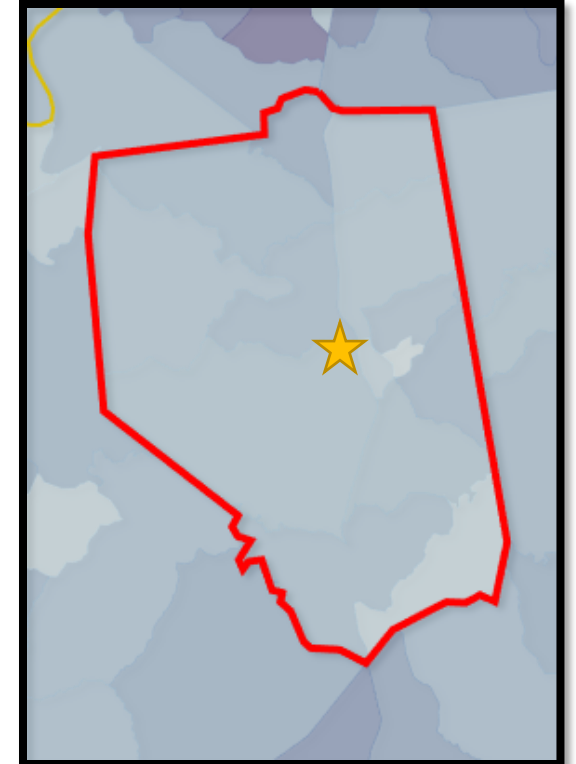




Williamstown Jr/Sr High School

Election Day County Wide Vote Center

- Located in the County Seat: Williamstown
- Already a voting location, housed 4 precincts prior to 2020
- Offers plenty of parking
- Entrance and Exit will be separated so voters will not cross paths
- Offers space conducive to serve as a vote center
- Serve voters in Williamstown and Dry Ridge communities

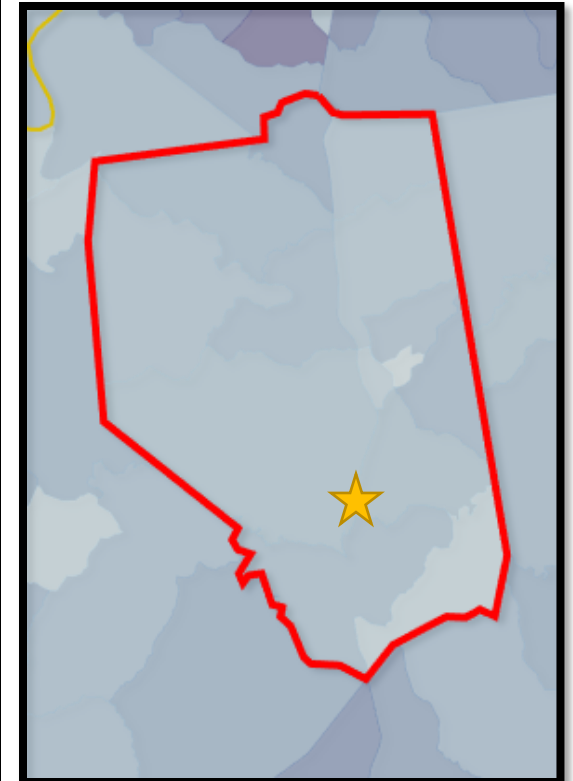




Mason Corinth Elementary

Election Day County Wide Vote Center

- Southern most school in Grant County
- Already a voting location, housed 1 precinct prior to 2020
- Replaces Corinth City Building Location, which housed 2 precincts, due to connectivity issues and limited space
- Offers plenty of parking
- Offers space conducive to serve as a vote center
- Serve voters in the Corinth, Keefer, and Southern Williamstown communities





Grant County Public Library

No Excuse In-Person Absentee Voting Location and Election Day

- Located in the County Seat: Williamstown
- Less than a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile from I-75 and US-25; both run the entire length of Grant County
- Well-known landmark in the County
- Offers plenty of parking and is current with all ADA standards
- Entrance and Exit provides a large hallway where seating will be removed and voters will not enter the library just the voting room
- Offers space, security cameras, and the ability to lock the room
