MEMORANDUM

RE: Hardin County 2024 General Election Plan

Attached you will find a copy of the 2024 General Election Plan for Hardin County. In our plan, we will continue to offer two locations for Early No Excuse Voting. In November 2023, we saw nearly 29% of Hardin County voters use early voting. Hardin Countians like this option and use it. When I took office as Clerk in January 2023, we only had one location for Early No Excuse voting, now we offer two.

For General Election Day, we are offering fifteen locations, up from just twelve last year, and **eleven** more locations than were available for the 2020 General Election. In 2022, Hardin County only offered ten locations. I have increased our number of locations with each year's elections and I am proud to offer my citizens a 50% increase in locations. Additionally, our plan calls for more clerk stations at most of our locations to allow us to increase capacity to quickly get voters checked in and handed their ballot. As you review this plan, I hope you will take in consideration, both the increase in locations and increase in capacity. This was developed based on feedback I received directly from my constituents.

Included in this packet is a map of Hardin County with our locations marked. If you are unfamiliar with Hardin County, it may look like we have some gaps. Let me help you understand those areas. In southern Hardin County is an area known as White Mills. From this area it is only an eight-minute drive to Lakewood Elementary School. I am confident we can serve this area from that site. There is also a gap in the area of Howealley. We have spent a lot of time looking at this area. The only government owned building is the KY 86 Fire Department, which is unfit for a polling location. It doesn't meet any of the basic ADA requirements for a vote center. From Howealley, a voter is, **at most**, 13 miles from James T Alton Middle School, or 10 miles from the vote centers at Meeting Creek or Cecilia Valley School (a newly added site for 2024). We are confident that we have adequately ensured accessible locations to all voters in Hardin County.

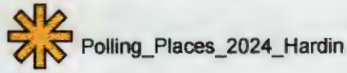

The consolidation of precincts is necessary in Hardin County to best serve our voters where they are from 6a to 6p on Election Day. Additionally, we only have enough equipment and election officers to operate the 12 vote centers indicated in our plan.
