1) **Why is this consolidation of these precincts desirable?**

This proposed consolidation of precincts is the plan Woodford County utilized for the elections in 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024. The entire process of having a voting center at Falling Springs Recreation Center was extremely well-received by the Woodford County voters. This is due to the efficiency and speed of their voting experience because of there being absolutely no problems with long lines due to having 15 check-in stations and 138 voting booths. The replication of the clearly defined, successful plan that was used in previous elections at the Falling Springs Voting Center, **which is centrally located in the middle of the county**, is respectfully requested for consideration.

The Woodford County Board of Elections received enormous positive feedback from voters on Election Day (while voting at Falling Springs Recreation Center), and weeks after the election. Several aspects of voting at this voting center have been increased to include:

- 3 basketball courts with 12 check-in stations, equipped with 120 voting booths;
- a multi-purpose room close to the front entrance with 2 check-in stations, equipped with 16 voting booths, and;
- a front door check-in station that has a Verity Duo machine for the safe, accessibility for voters with mobility issues, equipped with 2 voting booths that accommodate a wheelchair.

This plan provides a total of 15 check-in stations and 138 voting booths. Based on previous elections, having 15 clerks available to sign in voters on the E-Poll Book produces a 45 second to 1 minute check-in time. Any delay to move a voter through the check-in process to receive their ballot and cast their vote would be minimal to none. As in the past elections, a command center will be stationed at this voting center that will have six (6) deputy county clerk's there to accommodate any of the voting needs that may arise such as change of addresses, validating a correct address to be assured that voter is receiving the correct ballot, and filling out all other forms necessary for the administration of this election.

The size of the parking lot at this voting center will accommodate approximately 350 parking spaces for the largest number of participants, by design, due to the many activities, i.e., sporting events, theater attendance, etc. that are held there daily.

As in previous elections, there will be golfcarts available on the lot to pick up voters from their cars and deliver them to the door of the voting center **and back to their car after they have voted**. Additionally, we have a wheelchair ready and accessible for any voter with mobility issues who needs assistance getting from the curbside handicap parking space to the front door.

2. In what manner will Precinct Officers be assigned?

With 15 check-in stations available, there will be a Clerk, a Democratic Judge, and a Republican Judge at each station. There is no need to have a Sheriff assigned to each station; however, there will be one Sheriff assigned to oversee the needs of each basketball court and the multi-purpose room, and 2 Sheriff's at the front door to accommodate the needs of any voter who has mobility issues. By using this order of assignment, there would be a reduction of 9 Sheriffs assigned as Precinct Election Officers, creating a savings to the fiscal court.

3. How will the voting location be publicized to voters? How will the location be noted as a "Vote Center?"

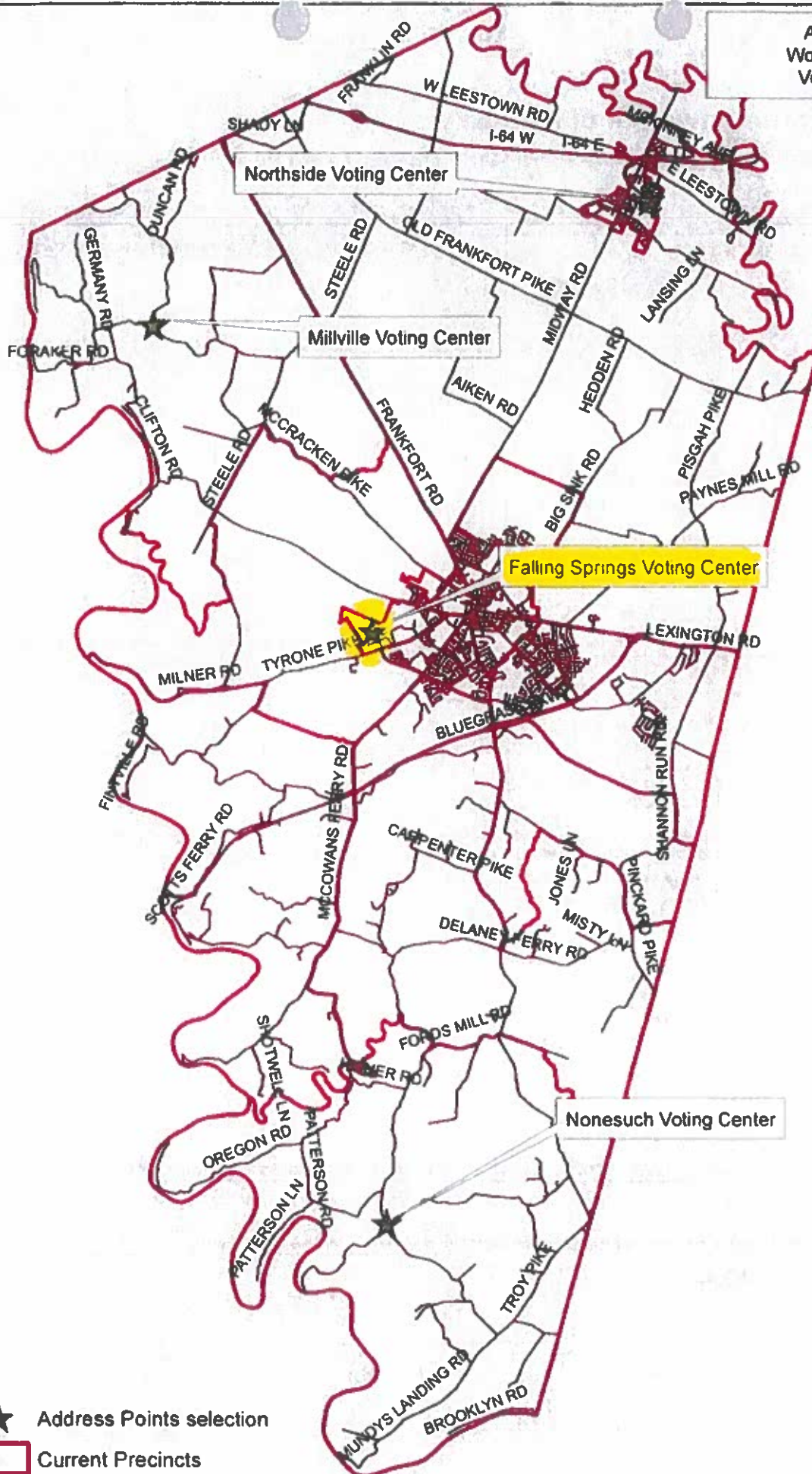
First and foremost, all Precinct Election Officers who witnessed the positive voting experience at the "Falling Springs Voting Center" while serving during the 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024 Elections is the best form of publicity. They would not only be announcing the location, but they would be able to express as a first-hand witness how the voting process was efficient and fast at Falling Springs and how the large parking was not an issue for voters with mobility issues due to having 3 golfcarts available to move voters from their parking space to the front door. Of course, the normal forms of advertising would be used such as our local newspaper, social media, a text messaging service, and signage. This location would be noted as the **"Falling Springs Voting Center."**

4. How will the voting location serve as a focal point to meet the needs of a diverse community??

The Falling Springs Recreation Center is the focal point of our entire community. If you are familiar with the center and the County Park here in Woodford County, you know this facility is used by all ages with the theater, pools, basketball courts, fitness center, numerous ball fields, soccer stadium/football stadium, fairgrounds, etc.

The location of this center, which serves as the pivotal, essential hub of our community, is located in the center of the county as evidenced by the map attached. As shown on Attachment A, a Voting Center at the Falling Springs Recreation Center is more than reasonably accessible to all voters and can allow 138 voters to vote at one time.

1) Why is this consolidation of these precincts desirable?

This proposed consolidation of precincts is the voting plan the Woodford County Board of Elections utilized for the elections in 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024 Elections. The reason voters in Woodford County prefer the entire process of having a consolidated voting center at Northside Elementary School is because there are absolutely no problems at this voting center with long lines that would affect the efficiency and speed of their voting experience. The replication of this consolidated voting center that was used in previous elections at this location is respectfully requested for consideration.

This location was expanded to provide 4 check-in stations, 40 voting booths, 4 Verity Voting Machines, and 1 Verity Duo Voting Machine. This voting center can easily be utilized for the 2026 Primary and General Elections.

The voters who reside in the city limits of Midway would appreciate this voting center being approved, not only for the convenience of voting in their city, but also being granted a voting center in this location would validate the fact Midway is a separate city that deserves being awarded its own voting center. Additionally, the voters who live directly outside the city limits of Midway who utilized this voting center for previous elections, would also appreciate having the Northside Voting Center granted at the Northside Elementary School for both the 2026 Primary and General Elections.

2) In what manner will Precinct Officers be assigned?

With the expansion of having four (4) check-in stations and 40 voting booths available, there will be a Clerk, a Democratic Judge, and a Republican Judge at each of the four (4) stations. There is no need to have a Sheriff assigned to each station; however, there will be 2 Sheriffs assigned to oversee the needs of the voters at the Northside Elementary School Voting Center. As in the past elections, a command center will be stationed at this voting center that will have three (3) deputy county clerk's there to accommodate any of the voting needs that may arise such as change of addresses, validating a correct address to be assured that voter is receiving the correct ballot, and filling out all other forms necessary for the administration of this election.

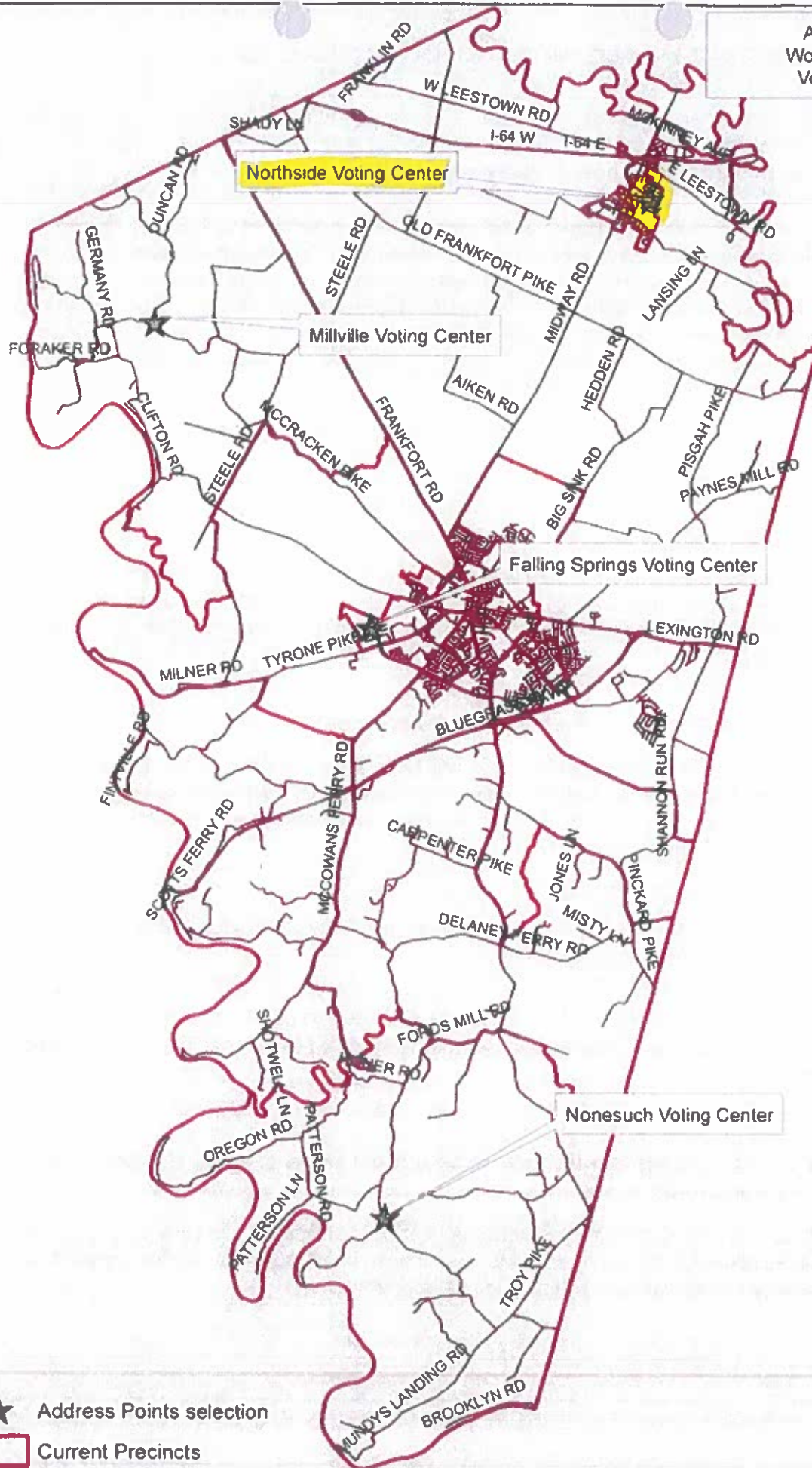
3) How will the voting location be publicized to voters? How will the location be noted as a "Vote Center?"

The normal forms of advertising would be used such as our local newspaper, social media, a text messaging service, and signage. This location would be referred to as the "Northside Voting Center."

4) How will the voting location serve as a focal point to meet the needs of a diverse community?

The location of the Northside Elementary School Voting Center would serve as the central voting location for Midway residents, and all residents that extend out to the Scott, Fayette, and Franklin County lines. As shown by Attachment A, this location is accessible to all voters in the Midway area and outlying areas adjoining surrounding counties.

The reason voters in Woodford County prefer the entire process of having a consolidated voting center at Millville Firehouse is because there are absolutely no problems at this voting center with long lines that would affect the efficiency and speed of their voting experience. The replication of this consolidated voting center that was used in previous elections at this location is respectfully requested for consideration.

The Millville Firehouse Voting Center that is located at the Millville Firehouse has been easily utilized during previous elections. As a result of the previous positive outcomes of this voting center, the voters in the Millville area are anticipating this voting center to be approved again for the Primary and General Election of 2026. This location has been expanded to provide 2 check-in stations, approximately 15 voting booths, 1 Verity Voting Machine, 1 Verity Duo Voting Machine, and accessible voting booths to accommodate the voters who have mobility issues.

The residents of Woodford County who live in the Millville area would appreciate the voting center being approved for the convenience of voting in their community of Millville. Additionally, this would validate the fact the voters in the northwest portion of the county deserve being awarded their own voting center.

2) In what manner will Precinct Officers be assigned?

With 2 check-in stations available, there will be 2 Clerks, 2 Democratic Judges, 2 Republican Judges and a Sheriff at this voting center. As in the past elections, a command center will be stationed at this voting center that will have a deputy county clerk there to accommodate any of the voting needs that may arise such as change of addresses, validating a correct address to be assured that voter is receiving the correct ballot, and filling out all other forms necessary for the administration of this election.

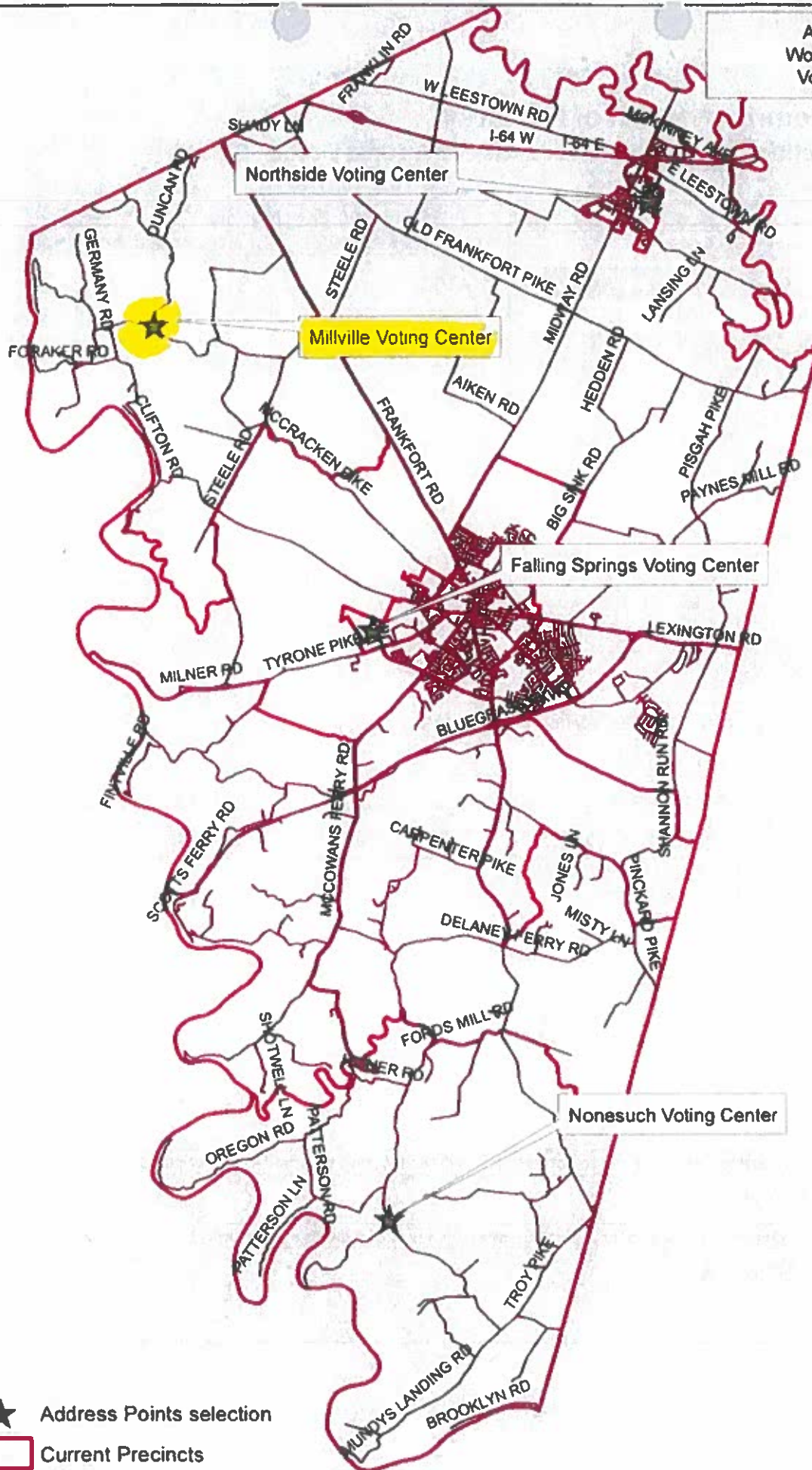
3) How will the voting location be publicized to voters? How will the location be noted as a "Vote Center?"

The reason voters in the southern end of Woodford County prefer a consolidated voting center at the Nonesuch Firehouse is because they have experienced no problems with long lines that would affect the efficiency and speed of their voting experience. The replication of this consolidated voting center that was used in previous elections at this location is respectfully requested for consideration.

The Nonesuch Firehouse Voting Center that is located at the Nonesuch Firehouse has been easily utilized for previous elections and the citizens of the Nonesuch area are anticipating this voting center to be approved again for the Primary and General Election of 2026. This location provides adequate space to have 2 check-in stations, approximately 15 voting booths, 1 Verity Voting Machines, and 1 Verity Duo Voting Machine.

The residents of Woodford County who live in the Nonesuch area would appreciate the voting center being approved for the convenience of voting in their community of Nonesuch. Additionally, this would validate the fact the voters in the southern part of the county deserve to have their own voting center like the other communities of Woodford County.

2) In what manner will Precinct Officers be assigned?

With two (2) check-in stations available, there will be a 2 Clerks, 2 Democratic Judges, 2 Republican Judges and a Sheriff to cover both stations.

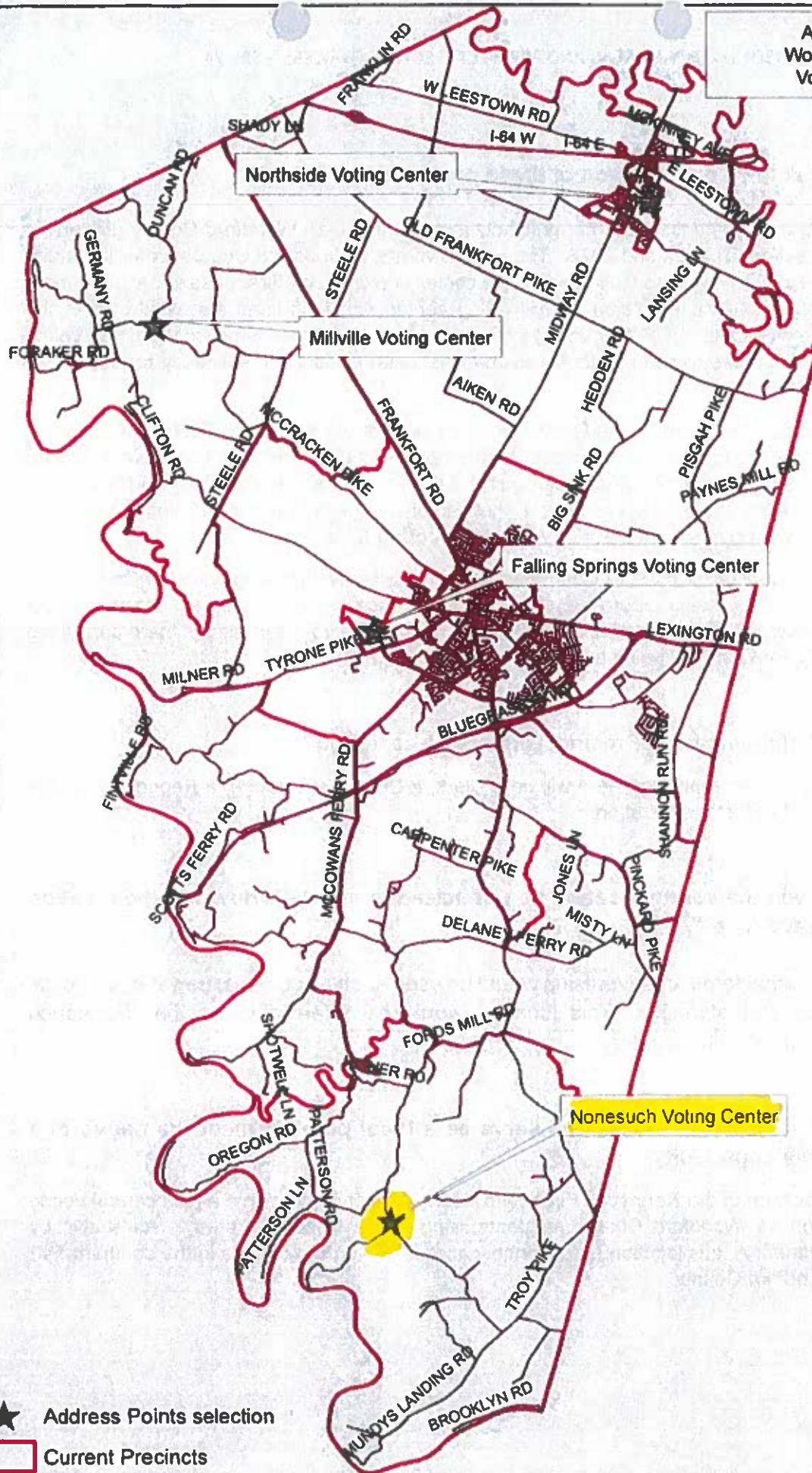
3) How will the voting location be publicized to voters? How will the location be noted as a “Vote Center?”
