VOTING LOCATIONS PROPOSAL FOR LOGAN COUNTY, KY

State Board of Elections,

Due to the positive outcome of the November 2020 election and the recent House Bill 574, our office is looking forward to some changes in where our voting centers will be located. We learned in our past election that the residents of our county liked the versatility of going to any of the voting centers, no matter where they lived in the county, and being able to vote their ballot.

Logan County Board of Elections is proposing to have five centers strategically positioned throughout the county to allow for convenience and accessibility for every voter. Currently, voters may have to travel up to 15+ miles to a precinct. Our future centers will put every resident in our county under 15 miles of their home (see attachment). The locations that we are proposing to use have the capacity to easily accommodate the citizens of Logan County. We propose to have one center located in Russellville and the other four located in schools throughout the county. In compliance with House Bill 574, we will use one ballot for the voting process that will be labeled with precinct ID in the corner of each ballot.

The voting centers have ample parking and are easily accessible to all citizens, including those with physical limitations. Four of the proposed voting centers are in school gymnasiums and one is in our National Guard Armory building in Russellville. All are large enough to accommodate an easy flow of people and will promote a safe voting environment.

We would appreciate your approval for the five proposed voting centers that will give the residents of Logan County the ability to vote at any location they may choose.

- Adairville Middle School 226 School Street, Adairville
- Auburn School 221 College Street, Auburn
- Lewisburg School 500 Stacker Street, Lewisburg
- Logan County High School 2200 Bowling Green Road, Russellville
- New National Guard Armory 100 Armory Drive, Russellville

STANDARDS FOR SETTING UP EACH VOTING CENTER

- There will be one way in and one way out of each center, clearly marked and easy to follow.
- 20 single voting booths for Adairville, Auburn and Lewisburg Schools. We will have 25 single voting booths for Logan County High School and the New National Guard Armory
- 1 four person handicap access voting booth per voting location
- 2 voting machines and 1 handicap marking device per voting location
- 1 spare machine in case of problems or large voter turn out per voting location
- 1 Sheriff per voting location
- 2 Machine Judges, one from each party, in each voting location
- 1 Ballot Judge for every 4 ballot faces used in each center
- 4 Clerks for every center

- 3 Floaters who will direct the flow of the precinct from the beginning to the end of the voting process. They will clean each station after being used and they will assist the Sheriff in helping the voters with any questions. They will also call the Clerk's Office when needed.
- 1 worker at each center who will have an Ipad to check voters and field any problems before they get to the clerk to check in

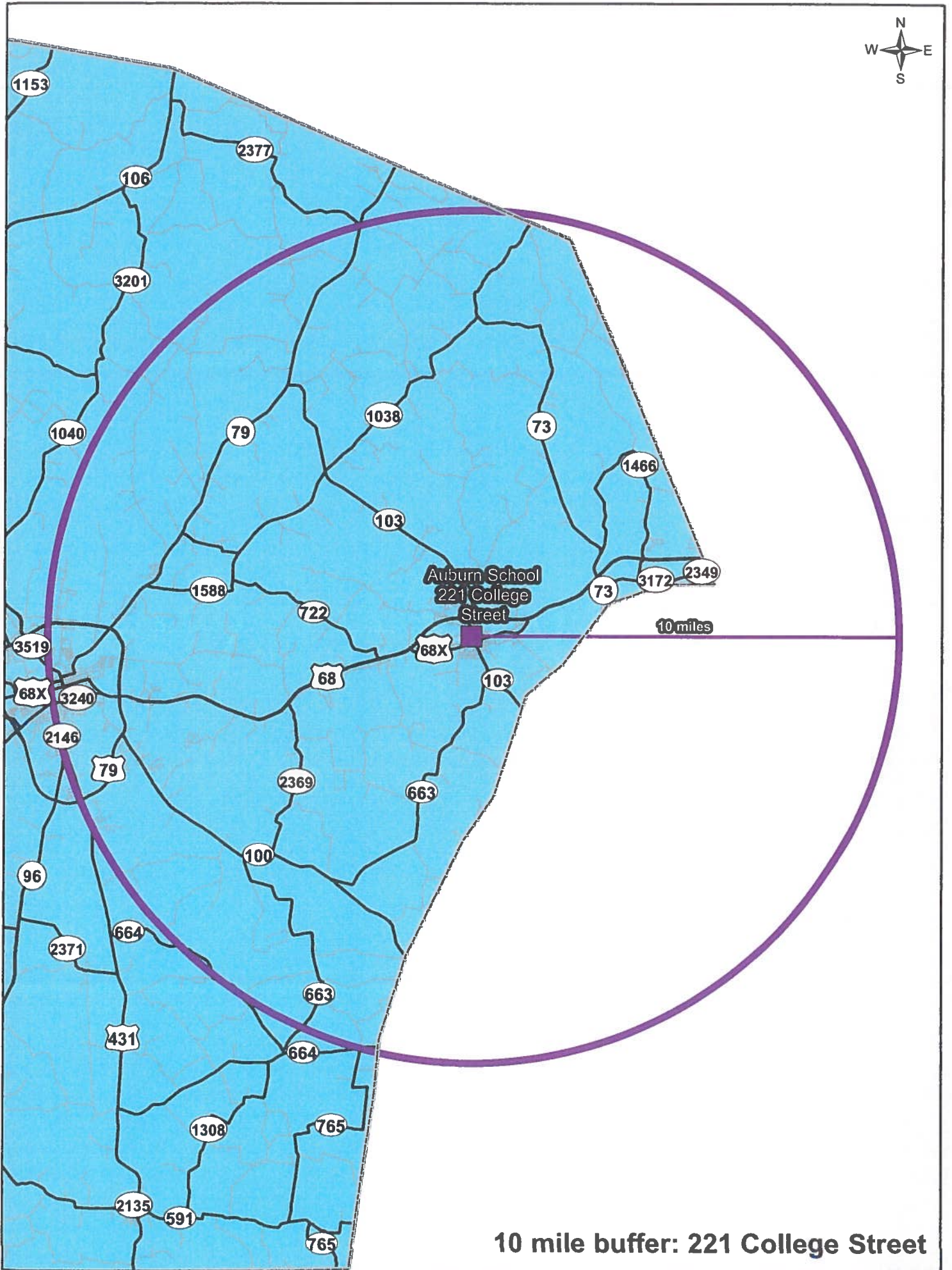
10 mile buffer: 600 Armory Drive



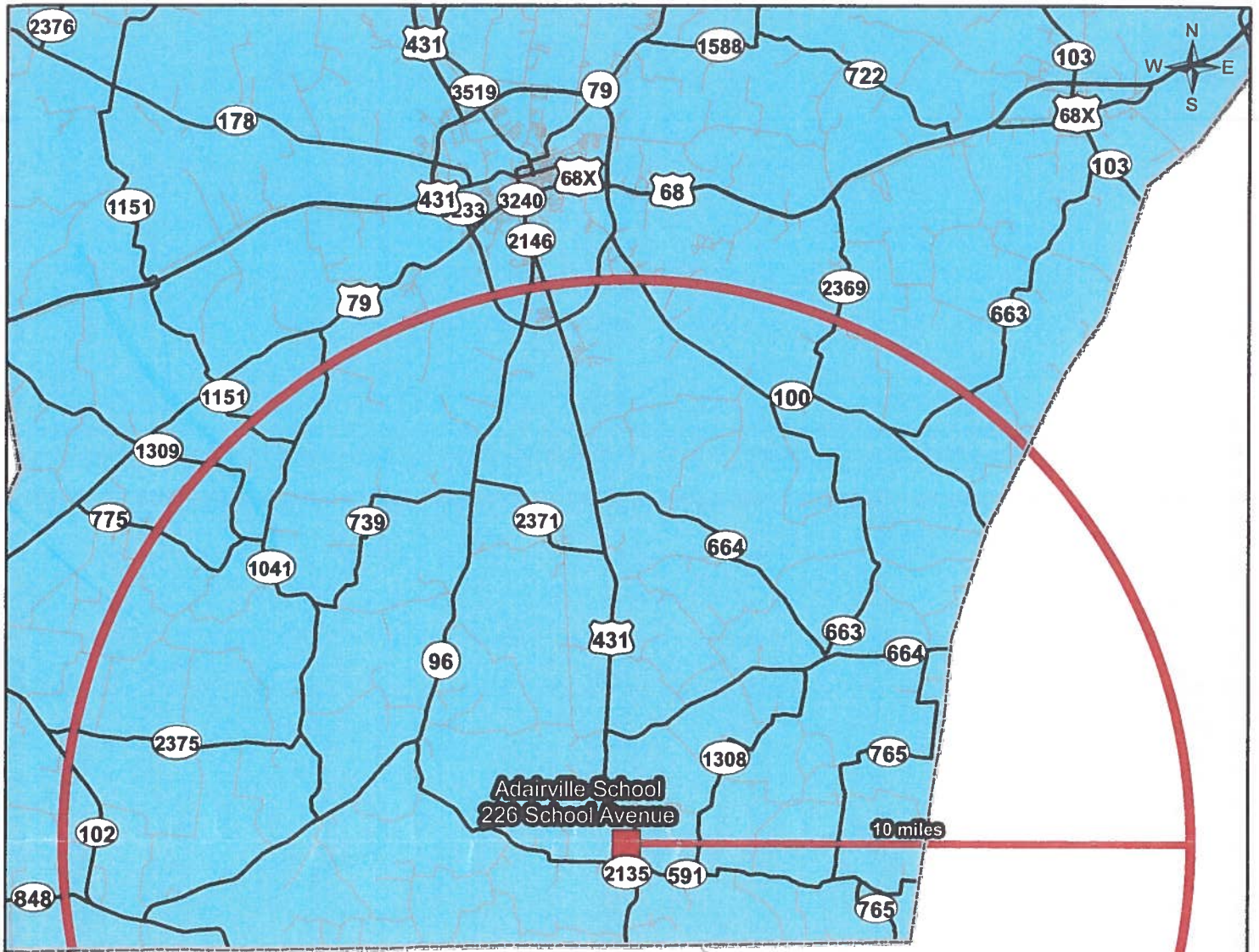


10 miles

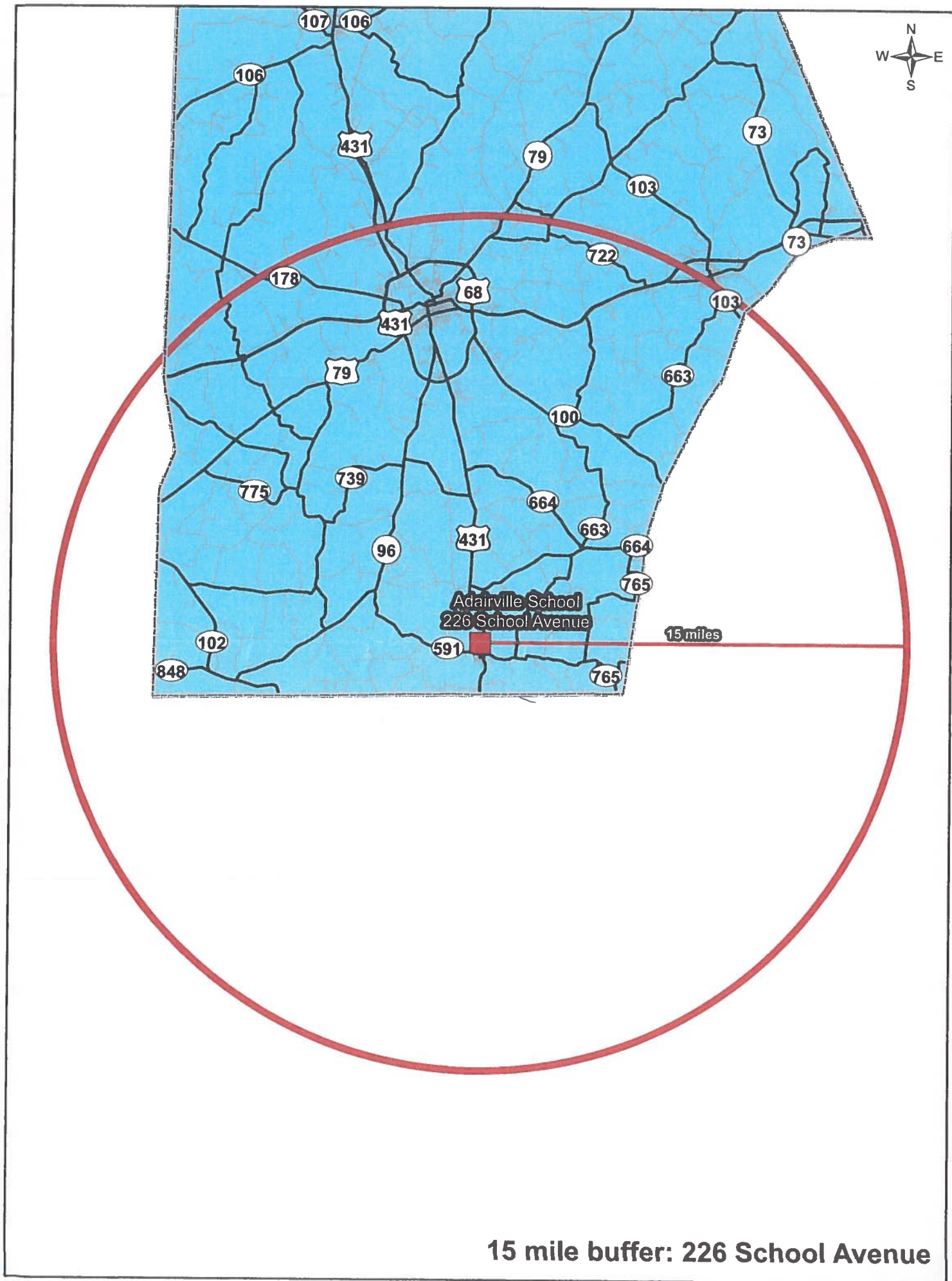
10 mile buffer: 750 Stacker Street



10 mile buffer: 221 College Street

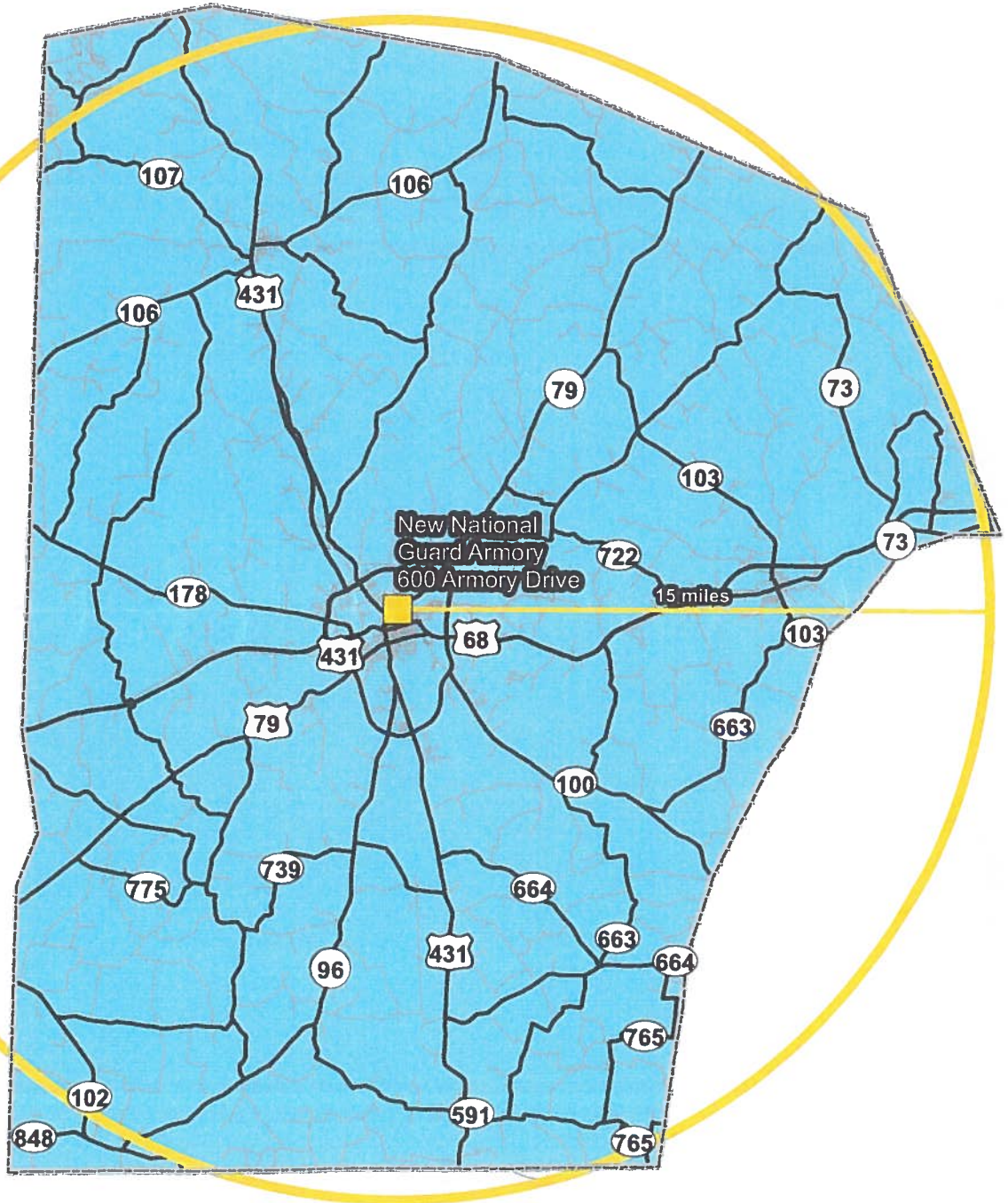


10 mile buffer: 226 School Avenue

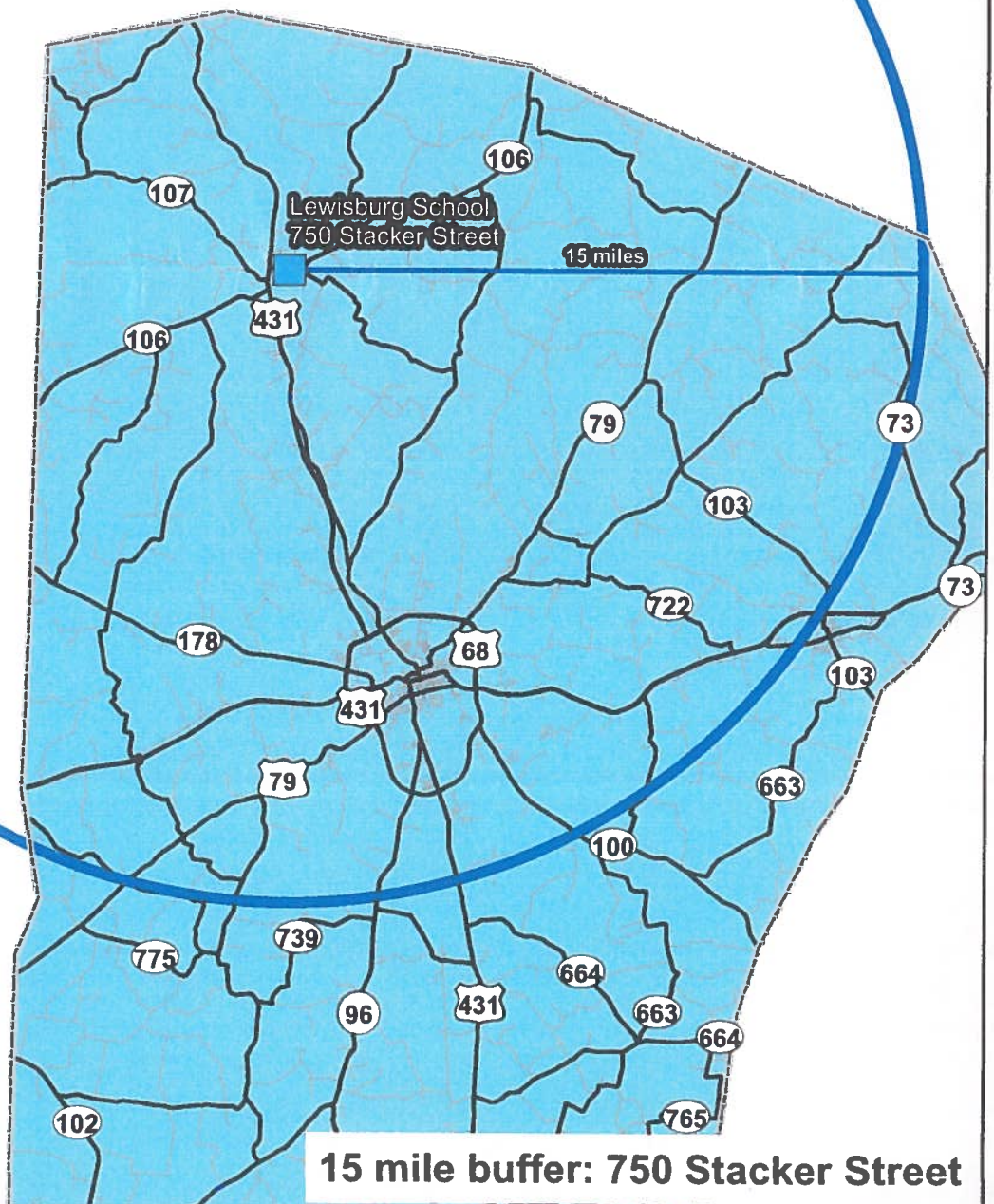




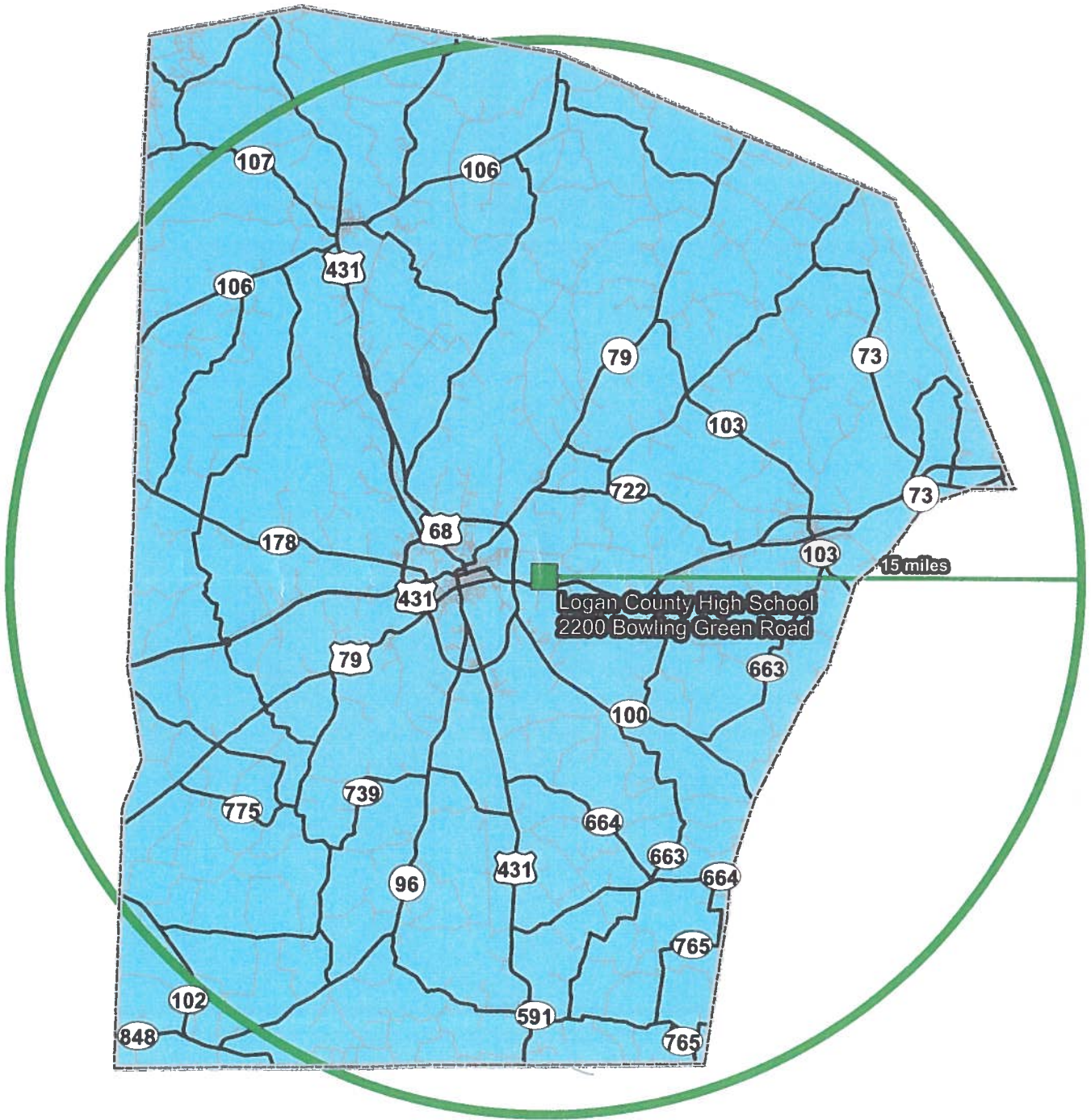
15 mile buffer: 221 College Street
